4. BOARD DISCUSSION AND ACTION ITEMS

a) **Silver Creek Roundabouts — Jody Anagnos (30 minutes)**

Jody is the Office Manager for Silver Creek Service Area 3, and Vince Pao-Borjigin is the Operations Manager. They are interested in looking into opportunities for new public art in some roundabouts in Silver Creek Estates. The roundabouts were recently completed, and there will be a new bus line coming through their transit center as well.

[Service area 3 is Silver Creek Estates, by the Sinclair station on the other side of the highway. It is a special district in UT and a part of Summit County. The County owns the roads, but the district manages them.](#)

[The district constructed 2 roundabouts by Bell's gas station and Lush's BBQ, and made improvements to the mail and transit centers. The roundabouts are owned by the County, and are thus eligible for public art placements.](#)

[Jody loves the art in Park City, and feels public art in Silver Creek would improve it. Possible projects could include a mural on the mailhouse, a metal structure on the chain link fences, a shade structure for bicycles, artworks on the transit center bus stop, artistic wayfinding signage, art on developing condos, or artworks placed within the roundabouts. Silver Creek residents are](#)

proud of their local elk herd, and there are many farms and horses in the area that might make appropriate public art subjects.

The Silver Creek Trustee Board is very excited about the initial idea to reach out to SCPAAB. Their budgeting sessions are in November, and this year there is a new Board. Board meetings are usually held on the 3rd Tuesday of the month.

Jody will collect Silver Creek resident and Board feedback about what kinds and locations of artworks they would like to see in their community, which will inform the budget. Jocelyn is happy to assist with this process. SCPAAB can then see what gaps it might be able to fill in as a partnership project, and help with the administration of an RFP/RFQ, artist selection, and project implementation. SCPAAB has not yet done any projects in Silver Creek, and the aim of the Board is to serve all of Summit County. SCPAAB administrators will coordinate with the Board and with Jody to possibly send a SCPAAB member to a future Silver Creek Board meeting.

b) Arts & Culture Master Planning Roundtable — Amanda Golden (15 minutes)

As part of the Arts Council's [Arts & Culture Master Planning](#) efforts for Summit County, consultants from Designing Local would like to host a Public Art and Creative Placemaking Roundtable which would bring both the Summit County Public Art Board and the Park City Public Art Board together for a robust discussion about a regional approach to public art, future desires and priorities, asset mapping, etc.

Amanda is the co-founder and managing principal of Designing Local, a firm out of Ohio that specializes in cultural planning and placemaking. Jocelyn and Amanda have been working together for 6 months on the Summit County Arts & Culture Master Plan.

An engagement opportunity is slated for February 21, 9:30-11am in the Large Auditorium of the Richins Building. This event will be a public art roundtable which brings together members of SCPAAB and PCPAAB. This will be advertised and posted as a public meeting in the event that we have a quorum. This will be the first time since 2018 that both Public Art Advisory Boards have been brought together. There will be coffee, pastries, and robust discussion with board members, artists, and residents. Amanda will lead the discussion and Jocelyn will facilitate. No votes will be agendaized, this will be a discussion only. Amanda will take notes, and Thea will summarize them for the meeting minutes. Staff will send out calendar invites to SCPAAB and will invite Jody and Vince.

c) Jeremy Ranch/Pinebrook Roundabouts Community Engagement Plan — Thea Henney (10 minutes)

The Board appreciates the wonderful update photos the artists have provided.

Jocelyn, Dan, and Thea will meet with the artists tomorrow and discuss the Community Engagement plan. They will convey the Board's desire to include all Summit County students in the naming contents for the sculptures, perhaps through a digital campaign, poll, or survey.

d) Art Piano Donation — Thea Henney (20 minutes)

Sherri Smoot would like to donate a 1898 upright grand piano for the Art Pianos For All project. It might be possible to host a piano at CREATE PC. We can apply for 2025 RAP grant funding to decorate the piano. The piano is located at Sherri's daughter's house in Kamas.

Piano dimensions:

Length: 58.5 inches

Depth: 28.5 inches

Height: 56 inches

Tuning: A professional tuner said it cannot be tuned to perfect pitch, and is ½ step off.

Timeline: The piano can remain in Kamas until spring; the timeline is flexible.

Delivery Fee: estimated between \$300-450. Sherri does not wish to donate this fee, but the board may consider applying for funding to support this.

i) Discuss accepting an additional Art Piano

Thea discussed the piano with Dave at Barrus Pianos, who tunes and maintains the current Art Piano collection. The piano being ½ step off will affect its ability to be played in concert with other instruments. The Board would prefer to wait for a piano that can be used for programming with PC Opera, USUO, and other musicians.

ii) Vote on a course of action, if necessary

Jenny makes a motion to decline the donation offer, Betsey seconds. All vote in favor with none opposed. The motion to decline passes at 5:02pm.

e) **Favorite Public Art Piece Presentation — Jörg Rügemer (5 minutes)**

i) [Near Distance](#) is an artwork at the security checkpoint exit at SLC International Airport; the artists are Soonju Kwoon, Reihaneh Noori, and Hannah Vaughn. Please see attached images in the Board Packet.

Near Distance is an expression of shared horizon and humanity that abstractly represents the landscapes of Utah. Jörg encountered it the first time he flew out of SLC Airport, and felt happy to see it. The artists are architects and former students of Jörg's, and he spoke to Hannah Vaughn about the process of creating the artwork. Much time was spent sourcing and touching the materials to find the right textures to represent the Great Salt Lake, and visitors to the airport can touch the completed artwork.

Instead of a favorite artwork presentation, the Board will use this time during the MArch meeting to debrief the Public Art Roundtable. [Jocelyn will present Designing Local's notes and outcomes.](#)

Workshops will be held at CREATE PC, and snacks will be provided. Jenny suggests that each Board Member invite at least 3 friends to come to the workshops.

The new CREATE PC showcase will have a launch party on february 7th from 5-8pm. There will be about 50 local artists, including 10 new ones, and the launch is a chance to mix and mingle with the artists and shop their artworks.
