SNOW REMOVAL

Make sure any plowed snow remains on your property don't push snow off your property, into the right of way or across the road. Snow violations start at \$175 and go up to \$750 plus the cost of any damage.

Summit County Code, Section 7-3-5 states that it is unlawful for any person to deposit, haul, blow, push, or otherwise deposit accumulated snow within the right-of-way. Property Owners may be liable for damages or accidents resulting from snow deposited on the traveled roadway. The "traveled way" shall be defined as the width of the paved or graveled street and sidewalk. Snow shall not be deposited in the county road right of way within fifty feet (50') of an intersection.

If you use a snowplow service, know that any violations and damage are the property owner's responsibility.

Update from our Road Manager:

We have been busy wrapping up our summer projects before the snow flies. We got a late start due to all of the snow from last winter. Then our projects were delayed because contractors were pushed back for the same reason.


