Finance and Operations: Dan and Max met with the county council on January 17th to discuss interim financing. County Treasurer, Cory Forsling, reiterated her reservation of providing a loan prior to the district receiving approval from the electorate for taxing authority. The council members instructed the staff and attorneys to search for other means, including grants, to provide some interim financing. The council urged us to prepare a budget. County manager, Shayne Scott, will meet with us again soon in a work session to review progress.

Cemetery District Initial Information Gathering Survey

In 2012, the Summit County Council (Council) approved the creation of the Snyderville Basin Cemetery District (District) in response to the need for a cemetery in the Snyderville Basin (Park City Cemetery is not available to folks living outside Park City limits and there are no cemetery or mortuary services presently being provided in the Basin). In 2023, the Council appointed a five-member Board of Directors (Board) for the District. The mission of the District is to provide one or more public cemeteries to benefit residents of the Snyderville Basin area, and to provide for the improvement, maintenance, and beautification of such cemeteries. In September 2023, the Board had its initial meeting, and has met at least monthly since then to determine how to accomplish the goals established for the District by the Council.

The purpose of this survey is to gather initial feedback from the public on their support for a potential ballot measure to fund a cemetery in the District and their desires related to cemetery amenities, etc. This is the first of several surveys the District intends to make available to the public to provide input on a new cemetery in the Snyderville Basin.
