REMINDERS FOR FALL

- Make sure to have your sprinklers blown out. Water will freeze, expand and break irrigation lines leading to expensive fixes and leaks in the spring. Be sure to hire a reputable landscaper to ensure this work is done correctly.
- Snowmobiles and other motorized vehicles including motorcycles and dirt bikes are NOT allowed on any trails in Silver Creek Estates.
- Make sure you remind your snow removal contractors that they can NOT plow across the road and can NOT store snow in the right of way. We do issue snowplow violation letters and fees. Violation fees start at \$175 and include the cost to repair the road.
- Be mindful of the elk herd movement and feeding in the community.
- Check your annual water usage to stay within your annual allocation.

Road Project Recap

The Service Area was busy with road projects this summer. The Service Area teamed up with UDOT to get rotomill or tailings from I-80 to use on Service Area roads. The road material was free to the Service Area. Roads that were rotomilled include upper Cottonwood Trail, Vista Circle, Crescent Dr N and Oakridge Rd loop.

Summit Drive was also paved this summer.

We are still planning on slurry seal on the newly rotomilled roads to help preserve the roads.
